What are Heartworms?

Heartworm is a potentially deadly parasite that is transmitted only by mosquitos, which pick up larval heartworms, called microfilaria, circulating in the bloodstream of infected animals.

Your dog has already gone through heartworm treatment, which consisted of 30 days of doxycycline, then either 2 or 3 injections of Immiticide administered at one of our vet clinics. They were kept on kennel rest with limited activity while they went through treatment. They were on a course of prednisone while going through treatment and was given Heartworm prevention as well.

Please continue to administer the Heartworm prevention *monthly* and *year-round*.

- <u>Sentinel® for Dogs</u> (chewable, milbemycin oxime/lufenuron/praziquantel)
- <u>Revolution® for Dogs</u> (topical, selamectin)
- <u>Advantage Multi™for Dogs</u> (topical, imidacloprid + moxidectin)
- <u>Trifexis</u> (Milbemycin and spinosad)
- <u>ProHeart® 6 or 12</u> (injectable, given only by a veterinarian) Lasts 6 or 12 months. Not effective against intestinal parasites.
